***5a. Matters Arising from the Minutes***

Agenda Item 13 - To extend an Invitation to PCSO Ryan Thomas on virtual monthly meetings *or* a separate virtual meeting.

There has been a spate of anti social behaviour going on in the village the young people are not from the village.

Reports have also been received of issues in the play park.

The PCSO will be asked to contact Cllr. C. Thomas to discuss video cameras.

Agenda Item 19 – Ffordd-y-Felin. FCC Streetscene were to deal with the road before lockdown. Some of the road and potholes have been done and a small amount of tarmac, the bank needs looking at.

**6. FURTHER DISCUSSION OF IMPROVEMENTS TO THE ‘SUNSPOT JUNCTION AND THE HIGHWAY IN FRONT OF THE ‘OLD FARMERS’ Ffordd Y Llan.**

The Junction is functioning very well, majority of people are giving positive messages to the new Junction layout. Hedging has been removed and vegetation cleared, visibility fencing gives a clearer view on the approach to the Junction.

Landscaping work is still to be done. The flashing VAS (vehicle activated sign) is a little late coming on as vehicles approach the bend, this is being looked at and monitored by FCC Highways.

Cllr. B. Jones is still concerned regarding the right hand turn off the A5104 and would like to see the right hand turn prohibited.

TCC will monitor the way the Junction is working – Agenda November meeting.

It was requested by TCC a letter of thanks is sent to Mr S. Jones FCC Chief Officer of Streetscene and Transportation.

***Highway in front of the ‘Old Farmers’***

Members stated the contractors have done a good job of laying new tarmac. The planters are now positioned on the concrete apron against the property wall, which allows vehicles to park more safely. However there is a resident who is parking their vehicle inappropriately taking up two vehicle spaces. Cllr. C. Swan had spoken with the resident explaining TCC’s position. It would be helpful if the owner of the vehicle could park correctly giving consideration to other drivers who wish to park their vehicles.

Cllr. C. Swan proposed that parking bays go in.                      Seconded: Cllr. A. Marshall

To request the existing lines are burnt off.

It was stated parking bays might possibly be used to park cars all day. Members are aware that vehicles are permitted to park on the highway; putting parking bays in place would help vehicles park safely.

### **School Parking**

A comment was noted in the September meeting, since the closure of the School gate parking has become a lot worse on the highway. The Clerk had spoken with the Head of Ysgol Parc y Llan, both schools have put the following in place:- Taxis drop off and pick up in the car park ensuring the gate is closed when exiting the car park, there is also two disabled parking bays. The Schools have arranged staggered drop off times as to keep congestion on the highway to a minimum. Parents who walk their children to School walk in through the main gate and exit onto Bryn-yr-Ysgol. Cllr. A. Thomas feels it is a lot safer walking into school as there are no cars whizzing around. It was noted to encourage staff to use the car park. The area is still very congested during drop off and pick up times.

### **13. REMEMBRANCE SERVICE**

To review the current social distancing and consider whether TCC will be able to hold a Remembrance Service.

The Welsh Government has laid down guidelines for outdoor activities and these must be adhered to. The Covid-19 crisis is getting worse and it was agreed it would be irresponsible to hold a service.

The Chair prepared a draft letter, which was circulated, to all members for discussion.

The Chair proposed the following:- The beginning and end of the two minute silence will be marked by the ringing of the Church bells.

The draft letter will be amended to add in the Church bells. Members were happy for the letter to go onto the website and the Facebook site.

Cllr. B. Jones has written to Deeside Silver band explaining the situation of no Remembrance Service.

### **14. BROADBAND & 4G**

Cllr. A. Marshall stated he has not made much progress. The area around the Sunspot Junction – broadband is poor.

Queen Street – broadband is cutting in and out, possibly overload.

Another cabinet may be required in Treuddyn.

A blocked ditch is causing water to enter a cable junction pit affecting broadband and phone lines to Ffordd y Gilrhos and west to Ffordd y Rhos.

Cllr. Marshall will send photograph locations of the street cabinets to members.
